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Year at a Glance

Literacy in PEI

40% of kindergarten-aged children in PEI, who completed the Early Years Evaluation, did not meet the developmental milestones in at least one of the five skill areas. (2017 Children's Report)

900 children in PEI in grades K to 6 were referred to us by resource teachers this year because they were struggling with reading, writing and math. Note: This number would likely be higher if we did not limit the number of referrals.

45% of working-aged adults in PEI do not have the literacy and essential skills needed to succeed in our digital world. (PIAAC 2012)

Literacy is a basic human right. An investment in literacy is an investment in the future of PEI. Without strong literacy and essential skills it is difficult for people to be fully engaged at work, in their community and at home. Research shows improving literacy and essential skills creates:

- More employment and higher incomes
- A stronger economy
- Better health and well being
- Increased community and family engagement
- Less crime and safer communities

Our Mission

We ensure that literacy barriers are minimized and gaps in services are filled so that all people in PEI reach their highest achievable literacy level.

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Ready Set Learn

Ready Set Learn is a free summer tutoring program for children who struggle with reading, writing and math. We offer this program to children in grades K to 6 in English, French Immersion, and Francophone programs Island wide. Each child receives one hour of tutoring per week for eight weeks during the summer. This program addresses the 'summer slide' which is the loss of academic skills and knowledge children lose over the summer months. COVID– 19 continued to have an impact on our program this year. Our goal is to tutor 800 children each summer. Due to COVID-19 related expenses, public health protocols and limited funding, we could only tutor 500 children. This year, 400 children remained on the waitlist.

Imagination Library and Free Books for Kids

We are the local administrator for Dolly Parton's Imagination Library in PEI. Imagination Library is a free book-giving program devoted to inspiring a love of reading in children and families. Each month, children ages 0-4 enrolled in the program receive a high quality, age-appropriate book in the mail for free. As of March 2021, we had over 300 children on the waitlist for the Imagination Library program.

Our Free Books for Kids program distributes free children's books to families in need through Christmas Hampers in partnership with Food Banks and PEI Public Library Service. This year, there was a significant increase in demand for books.

Food Banks of PEI

Essential Employability Skills

Our Essential Employability Skills program prepares adults, who are underemployed or unemployed, for the workforce. This program gives participants 180 hours of classroom training and a six-week work placement in the healthcare sector. We partnered with employers who provided work placements with the goal of retaining program graduates as full time employees. Employers also participated in our 30-hour mentorship training that focused on helping new employees succeed in their roles.



24 adults gained essential employability skills and work experience

> 83% of program graduates gained full-time employment or enrolled in a post-secondary program in the field of healthcare

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Celebration of Learning

Our **Celebration of Learning** celebrates the success stories of learners, recognizes literacy champions in our community, and raises funds to support our literacy programs. This year's inaugural event was hosted in the Florence Simmons Performance Hall with MC and comedian Patrick Ledwell and PEI's Poet Laureate, Julie Pellissier-Lush. Approximately 100 people were in attendance and \$17,365 was raised to support literacy in PEI.

12 adults received financial support to return to school

At this event we awarded:

- 8 bursaries to adults working toward a GED
- 3 scholarships to adults who have their GED and are enrolled in a post-secondary program
- 1 Adult Learner Award (Patrick Curtis)
- Gzowski Literacy Champion Award (Barbara Macnutt)

Thousands of Islanders are better informed about literacy in PEI
